- 1840 Manchester Hymnal (1st Edition) & 1841 Nauvoo Hymnal: a data base sent to me by Kirk Kammeyer of www.earlyldshymns.com
- All the others: I have either turned the pages of the actual volumes themselves or viewed a PDF version.

For sources outside the actual hymnals themselves, the sources have been numerous. Additionally, some hymnals have names listed and some don't; I will be comparing this index to the two title indexes to try to cut discrepancies out. Please be patient with me; I'm not a professional.
